

Verb-Based Novelty Detection

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Introduction

Data is growing at very fast rates and there is a necessity to protect information. Also, there is a need to gather information on possible threats to society. Information Intelligence is essential for security. Focus on novelty is part of the process. So why focus on verbs only? There are not many verbs in a sentence. In an emergency, vast amounts of data might need to be processed and if a system only works with verbs, then processing time will be less than processing whole sentences. Also, once a flag has been triggered by the system an expert can determine if further investigation is needed.

Results


Table 1 provides information on the number of verbs in the article in relation to the total words in the article. In these two articles "a," "an," and "the" were removed since those three elements did not provide novel information. Table 2 shows the categories in which some verbs fall under, such as unique verbs, verb's novelty, and synonyms. Table 2 also keeps count of those categories. Additionally, verbs might fall under a general category, such as "inform," or "security" and Table 2 keeps count of the different categories.



Graph 1) This graph represents novelty with respect to previous sentences yes(1) or no(0). One line focuses on only verbs (diamond or triangle marker). The second line focuses on verbs and fillers (square or x marker). Graph 2) This graph illustrates novelty at each sentence with respect to previous sentences. Zero indicates no novelty and a four indicates very novel.

Filler: All elements of a sentence not containing verbs, nouns, "a," "an," and "the."

Conclusion

There is not enough evidence to support the claim that verb-based novelty detection contributes enough information. Table 2 shows the different general concepts found in the articles and in a verb-based novelty detection system those concepts can lead to different interpretations. Contribution of other elements that are part of the sentence helped define the subject. High peaks in the second graph are indicative of novelty and most of the novelty can be found at the beginning of the text. An observation worth noting is that there are relations between words that contribute enough information to know about the theme of the text.



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
